Why We Use the Name Jesus The Christ

Moses name

When Moses was born Egypt had the dominion, Moses was named by Pharaoh's daughter, which means drawn from the water in Egyptian or a Hamitic language, not Hebrew. If Pharaoh's daughter had named him with a Hebrew name, surely, they would have killed the child. So, the name Moses, being drawn from the water or deliverer, is from another tongue or Stranger's tongue.

"A Prophet like unto Moses."

Deu 18:15 The LORD thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto him ye shall hearken; Deu 18:16 According to all that thou desiredst of the LORD thy God in Horeb in the day of the assembly, saying, Let me not hear again the voice of the LORD my God, neither let me see this great fire any more, that I die not. Deu 18:17 And the LORD said unto me, They have well *spoken that* which they have spoken. Jesus name

Eze 20:35 And I will bring you into the wilderness of the people, and there will I plead with you face to face. Eze 20:36 Like as I pleaded with your fathers in the wilderness of the land of Egypt, so will I plead with you, saith the Lord GOD. In addition, people continue to reject and resist the name of Jesus because of various misunderstandings about word meanings and language interpretations. Statements like " the name of Jesus is not valid because of Hellenization is a gross error. Hellenization (American English) or Hellenisation (British) is the historical spread of ancient Greek culture and, to a lesser extent, language, over foreign peoples conquered by Greece or brought into its sphere of influence, particularly during the Hellenistic period following the campaigns of Alexander the Great.

Two gross misunderstandings or errors have been discovered.

1. Name translations and meaning of names.

Mathew 1:21

"And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins."

Matthew 1:23 "Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

The meaning of the name is what makes all difference here. This could not be referring to Zeus or any other pagan God. Remember, the meaning of the name came from Israel, the priest of God, not the Greeks, or the Gentiles. They only interpreted it the best way that they know how.

When the name of Jesus was interpreted from Hebrew to Greek, it was spelled it like $I\eta\sigma\sigma\dot{v}\varsigma$ or Iisoús, but it is pronounced "hey sus". Isn't that strange? Even though it sounds like Hail Zeus in English, it does not mean that is who it is in Hebrew. You cannot take the meaning of a name in one language and say it means the same in another language because they sound alike. Remember, meaning of not the the name came from Israel. Greece or Rome.

2. The letter J, and 1611 King James Bible. (This is the Killer One). Answer this: What was the

Alphabet before the Lord Confounded the languages in Genesis 11? No one knows. There could have been a J. One thing for sure, we know that there was a "J" sound, for example, many names are found in the Scriptures that either begin with the name "JAH" or end with it. • Abijah, Malchijah, Urijah, Adonijah, Tobijah, Elijah and many more (2 Chron. 12:16; 1 Chron. 9:12; 2 Kings 16:10; 2 Sam. 3:4; 2 Chron. 17:8; 1 Kings 18:1).

Question: Has the King James Bible been changed between 1611 and the present day?

Answer: There have only been two modifications of the King James Bible: printing corrections of printing errors and changes in the English language itself.

Printing Corrections

Typesetting in the 1600's was a very laborious task. Each letter on each page had to be put into place. Since there are 3,566,480 letters in the Bible, that left a lot of room for mistakes. However, in 1628, only 27 years after the first editions of the Bible were printed, 72 percent of around 400 printing corrections were already accomplished. By 1850, all corrections of printing errors were made (with the exception of two, which shall be detailed below).

Changes in the English Language

The King James Bible was originally printed in Gothic type. That means "v" looked like "u," "J" looked like "I," and there was an "s" that appeared in certain words that looked a little like our "f." So, "Iefvs" in Gothic type was the same as "Jesus" in Roman type. We currently read the Bibles in Roman print type. Changing the type from Gothic to Roman has been labeled by some as a "change," but it really is not. The words, themselves, were not changed, nor the way they were pronounced, only the way the letters were written.

But the spelling of words also changed. By the 1800s, "wee" was "we, "fheepe" was "sheep," "sayth" was "saith," and "euill" was "evil." But those spellings are not difficult. You can figure out what the words said, even from a 1611 copy.

Conclusion- The next time you hear somebody tell you that the letter "J" was not in the Original King James Bible, show them this. It was still pronounced the way we say today in 2023, "JESUS". The letters were only different and the English language has been reformed like every other language on the planet.
