Hebrews 11 - Precept Breakdown (By Faith)

Heb:11:1: Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. **2:** For by it the elders obtained a good report. **3:** Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.

Heb:11:4: By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, by which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts: and by it he being dead yet speaketh.



Gen:4:1: And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD. **2:** And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground. **3:** And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD. **4:** And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the LORD had respect unto Abel and to his offering: **5:** But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell. **6:** And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen? **7:** If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee shall be his desire, and thou shalt rule over him. **8:** And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him. **9:** And the LORD said unto Cain, Where is Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: Am I my brother's keeper? **10:** And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground.

Heb:11:5: By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.



Gen:5:21: And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat Methuselah: **22:** And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters: **23:** And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years: **24:** And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him.

Heb:11:7: By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith. ↓

Gen:6:13: And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth. **14:** Make thee an ark of gopher wood; rooms shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt pitch it within and without with pitch. **15:** And this is the fashion which thou shalt make it of: The length of the ark shall be three hundred cubits, the breadth of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits.

16: A window shalt thou make to the ark, and in a cubit shalt thou finish it above; and the door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof; with lower, second, and third stories shalt thou make it. **17:** And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the breath of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall die. **18:** But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee. **19:** And of every living thing of all flesh, two of every sort shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep them alive with thee; they shall be male and female. **20:** Of fowls after their kind, and of cattle after their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after his kind, two of every sort shall come unto thee, to keep them alive. **21:** And take thou unto thee of all food that is eaten, and thou shalt gather it to thee; and it shall be for food for thee, and for them. **22:** Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he.

Heb:11:8: By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went. **9:** By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: ↓

Gen:12:1: Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: **2:** And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: **3:** And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. **4:** So Abram departed, as the LORD had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran. **5:** And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came.

Heb:11:11: Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised. **12:** Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, so many as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the sand which is by the sea shore innumerable. ↓

Gen:17:15: And God said unto Abraham, As for Sarai thy wife, thou shalt not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall her name be. **16:** And I will bless her, and give thee a son also of her: yea, I will bless her, and she shall be a mother of nations; kings of people shall be of her.

Heb:11:17: By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son, **18:** Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called: **19:** Accounting that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure. ↓

Gen:22:1: And it came to pass after these things, that God did tempt Abraham, and said unto him, Abraham: and he said, Behold, here I am. **2:** And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of. **3:** And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son, and clave the wood for the burnt offering, and rose up, and went unto the place of which God had told him. **4:** Then on the third day Abraham lifted up his eyes, and saw the place afar off. **5:** And Abraham said unto his young men, Abide ye here with the ass; and I and the lad will go yonder and worship, and come again to you. **6:** And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering, and laid it upon Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife; and they went both of them together. **7:** And Isaac spake unto Abraham his father, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I, my son. And he said, Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering? **8:** And Abraham said, My son, God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering: so they went both of them together. **9:** And they came to the place which God had told him of; and Abraham built an altar there, and laid the wood in order, and bound Isaac his son, and laid him on the altar upon the wood. **10:** And Abraham stretched forth his hand, and took the knife to slay his son. **11:** And the angel of the LORD called unto him out of heaven, and said, Abraham, Abraham: and he said, Here am I.

12: And he said, Lay not thine hand upon the lad, neither do thou any thing unto him: for now I know that thou fearest God, seeing thou hast not withheld thy son, thine only son from me. **13:** And Abraham lifted up his eyes, and looked, and behold behind him a ram caught in a thicket by his horns: and Abraham went and took the ram, and offered him up for a burnt offering in the stead of his son.

Heb:11:20: By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.



Gen:27:27: And he came near, and kissed him: and he smelled the smell of his raiment, and blessed him, and said, See, the smell of my son is as the smell of a field which the LORD hath blessed: **28:** Therefore God give thee of the dew of heaven, and the fatness of the earth, and plenty of corn and wine: **29:** Let people serve thee, and nations bow down to thee: be lord over thy brethren, and let thy mother's sons bow down to thee: cursed be every one that curseth thee, and blessed be he that blesseth thee. **30:** And it came to pass, as soon as Isaac had made an end of blessing Jacob, and Jacob was yet scarce gone out from the presence of Isaac his father, that Esau his brother came in from his hunting. **31:** And he also had made savoury meat, and brought it unto his father, and said unto his father, Let my father arise, and eat of his son's venison, that thy soul may bless me. **32:** And Isaac his father said unto him, Who art thou? And he said, I am thy son, thy firstborn Esau. **33:** And Isaac trembled very exceedingly, and said, Who? where is he that hath taken venison, and brought it me, and I have eaten of all before thou camest, and have blessed him? yea, and he shall be blessed. **34:** And when Esau heard the words of his father, he cried with a great and exceeding bitter cry, and said unto his father, Bless me, even me also, O my father. **35:** And he said, Thy brother came with subtilty, and hath taken away thy blessing. **36:** And he said, Is not he rightly named Jacob? for he hath supplanted me these two times: he took away my birthright; and, behold, now he hath taken away my blessing. And he said, Hast thou not reserved a blessing for me? **37:** And Isaac answered and said unto Esau, Behold, I have made him thy lord, and all his brethren have I given to him for servants; and with corn and wine have I sustained him: and what shall I do now unto thee, my son? **38:** And Esau said unto his father, Hast thou but one blessing, my father? bless me, even me also, O my father. And Esau lifted up his voice, and wept. **39:** And Isaac his father answered and said unto him, Behold, thy dwelling shall be the fatness of the earth, and of the dew of heaven from above;

Heb:11:21: By faith Jacob, when he was a dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, leaning upon the top of his staff.



Gen:48:8: And Israel beheld Joseph's sons, and said, Who are these? **9:** And Joseph said unto his father, They are my sons, whom God hath given me in this place. And he said, Bring them, I pray thee, unto me, and I will bless them. **10:** Now the eyes of Israel were dim for age, so that he could not see. And he brought them near unto him; and he kissed them, and embraced them. **11:** And Israel said unto Joseph, I had not thought to see thy face: and, lo, God hath shewed me also thy seed. **12:** And Joseph brought them out from between his knees, and he bowed himself with his face to the earth. **13:** And Joseph took them both, Ephraim in his right hand toward Israel's left hand, and Manasseh in his left hand toward Israel's right hand, and brought them near unto him. **14:** And Israel stretched out his right hand, and laid it upon Ephraim's head, who was the younger, and his left hand upon Manasseh's head, guiding his hands wittingly; for Manasseh was the firstborn. **15:** And he blessed Joseph, and said, God, before whom my fathers Abraham and Isaac did walk, the God which fed me all my life long unto this day, **16:** The Angel which redeemed me from all evil, bless the lads; and let my name be named on them, and the name of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; and let them grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth. **17:** And when Joseph saw that his father laid his right hand upon the head of Ephraim, it displeased him: and he held up his father's hand, to remove it from Ephraim's head unto Manasseh's head. **18:** And Joseph said unto his father, Not so, my father: for this is the firstborn; put thy right hand upon his head. **19:** And his father refused, and said, I know it, my son, I know it: he also shall become a people, and he also shall be great: but truly his younger brother shall be greater than he, and his seed shall become a multitude of nations. **20:** And he blessed them that day, saying, In thee shall Israel bless, saying, God make thee as Ephraim and as Manasseh: and he set Ephraim before Manasseh. **21:** And Israel said unto Joseph, Behold, I die: but God shall be with you, and bring you again unto the land of your fathers. **22:** Moreover I have given to thee one portion above thy brethren, which I took out of the hand of the Amorite with my sword and with my bow.

Heb:11:22: By faith Joseph, when he died, made mention of the departing of the children of Israel; and gave commandment concerning his bones.



Gen:50:24: And Joseph said unto his brethren, I die: and God will surely visit you, and bring you out of this land unto the land which he sware to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. **25:** And Joseph took an oath of the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you, and ye shall carry up my bones from hence. **26:** So Joseph died, being an hundred and ten years old: and they embalmed him, and he was put in a coffin in Egypt.

Heb:11:23: By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw he was a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.



Ex:1:15: And the king of Egypt spake to the Hebrew midwives, of which the name of the one was Shiprah, and the name of the other Puah: **16:** And he said, When ye do the office of a midwife to the Hebrew women, and see them upon the stools; if it be a son, then ye shall kill him: but if it be a daughter, then she shall live. **17:** But the midwives feared God, and did not as the king of Egypt commanded them, but saved the men children alive. **18:** And the king of Egypt called for the midwives, and said unto them, Why have ye done this thing, and have saved the men children alive? **19:** And the midwives said unto Pharaoh, Because the Hebrew women are not as the Egyptian women; for they are lively, and are delivered ere the midwives come in unto them. **20:** Therefore God dealt well with the midwives: and the people multiplied, and waxed very mighty. **21:** And it came to pass, because the midwives feared God, that he made them houses. **22:** And Pharaoh charged all his people, saying, Every son that is born ye shall cast into the river, and every daughter ye shall save alive.

Ex:2:1: And there went a man of the house of Levi, and took to wife a daughter of Levi. **2:** And the woman conceived, and bare a son: and when she saw him that he was a goodly child, she hid him three months.

Heb:11:24: By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; **25:** Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; **26:** Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.



Ex:2:3: And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child therein; and she laid it in the flags by the river's brink. **4:** And his sister stood afar off, to wit what would be done to him. **5:** And the daughter of Pharaoh came down to wash herself at the river; and her maidens walked along by the river's side; and when she saw the ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it. **6:** And when she had opened it, she saw the child: and, behold, the babe wept. And she had compassion on him, and said, This is one of the Hebrews' children. **7:** Then said his sister to Pharaoh's daughter, Shall I go and call to thee a nurse of the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for thee? **8:** And Pharaoh's daughter said to her, Go. And the maid went and called the child's mother. **9:** And Pharaoh's daughter said unto her, Take this child away, and nurse it for me, and I will give thee thy wages. And the woman took the child, and nursed it. **10:** And the child grew, and she brought him unto Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. And she called his name Moses: and she said, Because I drew him out of the water.

Heb:11:27: By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible. ↓

Ex:2:11: And it came to pass in those days, when Moses was grown, that he went out unto his brethren, and looked on their burdens: and he spied an Egyptian smiting an Hebrew, one of his brethren. **12:** And he looked this way and that way, and when he saw that there was no man, he slew the Egyptian, and hid him in the sand.

Heb:11:28: Through faith he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them. ↓

Ex:12:21: Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel, and said unto them, Draw out and take you a lamb according to your families, and kill the passover: **22:** And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip it in the blood that is in the bason, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that is in the bason; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning. **23:** For the LORD will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the LORD will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you.

24: And ye shall observe this thing for an ordinance to thee and to thy sons for ever. **25:** And it shall come to pass, when ye be come to the land which the LORD will give you, according as he hath promised, that ye shall keep this service. **26:** And it shall come to pass, when your children shall say unto you, What mean ye by this service? **27:** That ye shall say, It is the sacrifice of the LORD's passover, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt, when he smote the Egyptians, and delivered our houses. And the people bowed the head and worshipped.

Heb:11:29: By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned. ↓

Ex:14:14: The LORD shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your peace. **15:** And the LORD said unto Moses, Wherefore criest thou unto me? speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward: **16:** But lift thou up thy rod, and stretch out thine hand over the sea, and divide it: and the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea. **17:** And I, behold, I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians, and they shall follow them: and I will get me honour upon Pharaoh, and upon all his host, upon his chariots, and upon his horsemen. **18:** And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I have gotten me honour upon Pharaoh, upon his chariots, and upon his horsemen. **19:** And the angel of God, which went before the camp of Israel, removed and went behind them; and the pillar of the cloud went from before their face, and stood behind them: **20:** And it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel; and it was a cloud and darkness to them, but it gave light by night to these: so that the one came not near the other all the night. **21:** And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided. **22:** And the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea upon the dry ground: and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left. **23:** And the Egyptians pursued, and went in after them to the midst of the sea, even all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. **24:** And it came to pass, that in the morning watch the LORD looked unto the host of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and of the cloud, and troubled the host of the Egyptians, **25:** And took off their chariot wheels, that they drave them heavily: so that the Egyptians said, Let us flee from the face of Israel; for the LORD fighteth for them against the Egyptians.

26: And the LORD said unto Moses, Stretch out thine hand over the sea, that the waters may come again upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen. **27:** And Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to his strength when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled against it; and the LORD overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. **28:** And the waters returned, and covered the chariots, and the horsemen, and all the host of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them; there remained not so much as one of them. **29:** But the children of Israel walked upon dry land in the midst of the sea; and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left. **30:** Thus the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the sea shore. **31:** And Israel saw that great work which the LORD did upon the Egyptians: and the people feared the LORD, and believed the LORD, and his servant Moses.

Heb:11:30: By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.



Josh:6:15: And it came to pass on the seventh day, that they rose early about the dawning of the day, and compassed the city after the same manner seven times: only on that day they compassed the city seven times. **16:** And it came to pass at the seventh time, when the priests blew with the trumpets, Joshua said unto the people, Shout; for the LORD hath given you the city. **17:** And the city shall be accursed, even it, and all that are therein, to the LORD: only Rahab the harlot shall live, she and all that are with her in the house, because she hid the messengers that we sent. **18:** And ye, in any wise keep yourselves from the accursed thing, lest ye make yourselves accursed, when ye take of the accursed thing, and make the camp of Israel a curse, and trouble it. **19:** But all the silver, and gold, and vessels of brass and iron, are consecrated unto the LORD: they shall come into the treasury of the LORD. **20:** So the people shouted when the priests blew with the trumpets: and it came to pass, when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

Heb:11:31: By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.



Josh:2:1: And Joshua the son of Nun sent out of Shittim two men to spy secretly, saying, Go view the land, even Jericho. And they went, and came into an harlot's house, named Rahab, and lodged there. **2:** And it was told the king of Jericho, saying, Behold, there came men in hither to night of the children of Israel to search out the country. **3:** And the king of Jericho sent unto Rahab, saying, Bring forth the men that are come to thee, which are entered into thine house: for they be come to search out all the country. **4:** And the woman took the two men, and hid them, and said thus, There came men unto me, but I wist not whence they were: **5:** And it came to pass about the time of shutting of the gate, when it was dark, that the men went out: whither the men went I wot not: pursue after them quickly; for ye shall overtake them. **6:** But she had brought them up to the roof of the house, and hid them with the stalks of flax, which she had laid in order upon the roof. **7:** And the men pursued after them the way to Jordan unto the fords: and as soon as they which pursued after them were gone out, they shut the gate. **8:** And before they were laid down, she came up unto them upon the roof; **9:** And she said unto the men, I know that the LORD hath given you the land, and that your terror is fallen upon us, and that all the inhabitants of the land faint because of you. **10:** For we have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the Red sea for you, when ye came out of Egypt; and what ye did unto the two kings of the Amorites, that were on the other side Jordan, Sihon and Og, whom ye utterly destroyed. **11:** And as soon as we had heard these things, our hearts did melt, neither did there remain any more courage in any man, because of you: for the LORD your God, he is God in heaven above, and in earth beneath. **12:** Now therefore, I pray you, swear unto me by the LORD, since I have shewed you kindness, that ye will also shew kindness unto my father's house, and give me a true token: **13:** And that ye will save alive my father, and my mother, and my brethren, and my sisters, and all that they have, and deliver our lives from death. **14:** And the men answered her, Our life for yours, if ye utter not this our business. And it shall be, when the LORD hath given us the land, that we will deal kindly and truly with thee.

Faith / Faithful / Faithfully / Faithfulness (Unfaithful)

Romans 10:17 So then **faith** cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

1 Samuel 2:35 And I will raise me up a **faithful** priest, that shall do according to that which is in mine heart and in my mind: and I will build him a sure house; and he shall walk before mine a nointed for ever.

2 Chronicles 19:9 And he charged them, saying, Thus shall ye do in the fear of the Lord , **faithfully**, and with a perfect heart.

2 Corinthians 4:13 We having the same spirit of **faith**, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken; we also believe, and therefore speak;

Galatians 3:7 Know ye therefore that they which are of **faith**, the same are the children of Abraham.

Proverbs 25:19 Confidence in an **unfaithful** man in time of trouble is like a broken tooth, and a foot out of joint.

Lamentations 3:23 They are new every morning: great is thy **faithfulness**.

Habakkuk 2:4 Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his **faith**.

Matthew 16:8 Which when Jesus perceived, he said unto them, O ye of **little faith**, why reason ye among yourselves, because ye have brought no bread?

Luke 17:19 And he said unto him, Arise, go thy way: thy **faith** hath made thee whole.

Acts 16:5 And so were the churches established in the **faith**, and increased in number daily.

Romans 3:25 Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through **faith** in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

Psalm 89:1 I will sing of the mercies of the Lord for ever: with my mouth will I make known thy **faithfulness** to all generations

Nehemiah 7:2 That I gave my brother Hanani, and Hananiah the ruler of the palace, charge over Jerusalem: for he was a **faithful** man, and feared God above many.

1 Timothy 1:15 This is a **faithful** saying, and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief.

Titus 1:1 Paul, a servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the **faith** of God's elect, and the acknowledging of the truth which is after godliness;



Rev:21:1: And I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first heaven and the first earth were passed away; and there was no more sea. **2:** And I John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. **3:** And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God. **4:** And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away. **5:** And he that sat upon the throne said, Behold, I make all things new. And he said unto me, Write: for these words are true and **faithful**.

Faith and Works Bring Results

Gal 3: 16-22	Promise by faith of Jesus Christ given to believers
